The Delay of Carnality

Numbers 13:26-33; 14:10-16, 20

- A common word used in church today is carnal or carnality
- What does it mean?
 - (Web. def.) relating to or given to crude physical pleasures and appetites
 - In the church it is used as another word to describe the flesh nature of man that is contrary to the spirit nature of God
 - It can also, however, be applied to the Christian's life as well
 - The Carnal Christian is someone who, in their immaturity, is not influenced or controlled by the Holy Spirit but rather by his/her lower, flesh nature.
- It was the carnality of the Israelite men and women that led to their wandering in the desert for 40 years when they were at the entrance to the Promised Land
- READ the account from Numbers 13 and 14
- The people had already begun to slide away from God leading up to their downfall of carnality
 - Chapter 11 it begins with complaining about their difficulties and, specifically, no meat to eat (11:1,4)
 - Even Moses voices his own disbelief in God's power (11:21-22)
 - The people hoarded and dried the quail meat demonstrating an unbelief in God's power to sustain them (11:32)
 - Chapter 12 Miriam and Aaron complain that they are not being recognized in the same way that Moses is (12:1-2)
 - This all took place **after** the 10 plagues, the parting of the Red Sea, the pillar of cloud and fire, brining water from the rocks, etc...
 - Sin very often will slowly work its way into your life but that also gives you the opportunity to spot it if you are willing to look for it (ex: man cheating on his wife)
 - The people's carnality (pleasures of their flesh) were influencing and controlling their actions and it kept them from their promised land
- The enemy wants to keep you from your promise land today
- What is the "Promised Land?"
 - 1. God's destination for your life
 - 2. His place of fulfillment (satisfaction) for you
 - 3. His place of a life of joy
 - 4. His place of physical, emotional, and spiritual prosperity
 - 5. His place of peace
- If those are the places God wants us to reach, how is it that we position ourselves to miss them?
- The same way the Israelites did and the consequences will be very similar
- This happens in four primary ways:

- 1. When you fix your attention on the obstacles rather than the objective
- Fear replaces your faith
- When the spies were sent out their mission was to come back and recommend strategies for the best way to take the land not determine if they could
- The land was exactly what God told them it would be (13:27)
- But they also saw things that God had not told them (13:28)
- Obstacles are the things that will frighten you when you take your eyes off of the objective given to you by God
- In these times your vision changes:
 - # You stop using your spiritual eyes which is where you can see and hold to the promises of God
 - # Instead you are using your natural eyes which can only see what is physically right in front of you
- When you focus on the difficulties and possible dangers you will never take the necessary risks
- 2. When you compare what you lack compared to what others have
- Intimidation will replace your confidence
- When you insist on measuring yourself through comparison things will look like grasshoppers to giants (13:33)
- The Israelites were not grasshoppers in God's sight nor in the sight of the Hittites, the Jebusites, the Amorites, or the Canaanites
- They were only grasshoppers in their own sight
- When they compared themselves to everyone else they took their eyes off of God and fear was able to come in (14:1)
- They left the realm of the supernatural place of God's provision and ran to the limited place of the natural
- 3. When you allow that fear to take control of your life circumstances
- Your desire for relief will overwhelm your courage
- Their fear whipped them into an all-night pity-party
- They were even prepared to go back into the slavery of Egypt (14:3)
- Many are the same way today
 - # At the first sign of discomfort or things getting hard they want to rush right back into their place of captivity
 - # I wonder how many of you this morning are still in your placed of captivity because it got difficult?
- Then they looked to blame their leadership (14:4)
- There will be always someone who will lead you back into the things of the past
- 4. When you set your mind to disobey you will miss out on the depth of God's instruction for your life
- Your goal becomes instant self-gratification and relief of your difficulties rather than the cultivation of character through a difficult and challenging journey
- And there is nothing that you will not do to get your relief

- No circumstance, no person, no truth, and no consequence will prevent you from getting what you want
- As a result, there is no growth, there is no increase, and there is no blessing
- An entire generation of people lost out on the blessing that God had in store for them
- They wandered in the desert with the knowledge that they were headed in the wrong direction
- Those times in your life very quickly demonstrate and expose the maturity of your walk with God
- You can talk a great game, look like you have it all together, and fool a lot of people but you may also never get out of your desert and into the promised land that God has waiting for you
- Keep your eyes on God's objective not the obstacles
- Don't compare yourself to anyone else or any other circumstances
- Refuse to allow fear to enter in
- Set your mind, body, and spirit with an unwavering commitment to obey God and His Word
