## Remnant Life Church Sunday, March 24, 2013 Palm Sunday

## "Holy Week – No Greater Love" Matthew 21-28; Mark 11-16; Luke 19-24; John 12-20

- The last week of Jesus' life was a time of preparation, teaching and continuing to demonstrate who He was.
- Dating the month of Nisan (March/April today)
  - O Lambs were slain on Nisan the 14<sup>th</sup> day between 3 and 5 p.m. according to Exodus 12
  - Year of 30 AD dating His birth at 3 BC using Herod, John the Baptist's birth and Passover
- The events around and leading to His death and resurrection fulfilled not only prophesy but the ongoing celebration of God's love
  - Over 300 prophesies are written about the coming Jesus the coming Messiah in the OT many over 700 years before His birth
    - Descendent of David Psalms (1000 years) and Jeremiah (600 years)
    - Born of a virgin Isaiah (700 years)
    - Born in Bethlehem Micah (700 years)
  - o Evidence That Demands a Verdict Josh McDowell
    - The odds of 1 man fulfilling only 8 prophecies
      - 1 in 100 trillion
      - 100 trillion silver dollars spread over an area the size of Texas would be 2 feet deep
      - Mark one coin with a red X
      - Mix all the coins around
      - Blindfold a man; let him go anywhere throughout the state he wishes and have him pick out that coin
- Events are recorded in all 4 gospels
- 1. Begin the trip from Galilee to Jerusalem
  - a. The rich young man (Matt 19; Mark 10; Luke 18)

- b. Meet Zaccheus passing through Jericho a man Jesus ate a meal with even though he was not respected in the Jewish community because he stole from the people as a tax collector (Luke 19)
- c. Arrive at the home of Lazarus, Mary and Martha in Bethany during the day on Friday
- 2. Friday evening Mary anoints the feet of Jesus (John 12:2-11)
  - a. Judas rebuked her saying that the money could have been used for the poor (Matt 26; Mark 14; John 12)
  - b. He actually wanted the money for himself (John 12)
- 3. Saturday the Sabbath day of rest

## 4. Sunday

- a. Jesus rides into the city fulfilling the prophesy by Zechariah (Matt 21; Mark 11; Luke 19; John 12)
- b. He is presenting Himself to the people as their Messiah
- c. That date would have been Nisan 10 the same day that the pilgrims presented their lambs for inspection to the priests for Passover
- 5. Monday a day of strange events
  - a. Cursing of the fig tree (Matt. 21; Mark 11; Luke 19) symbolizing the curse on Jerusalem and that the Kingdom will be taken from the nation (Matt. 23)
  - b. Driving the money changers from the temple (Mark 11:27-13:37)
- 6. Tuesday confronts the religious leaders and authorities as they question why He did what He did at the temple; teaches on many topics (Matt. 22; Mark 12; Luke 10)
  - a. The disciples have many questions as they return to Bethany
  - b. Jesus stops at the Mt. of Olives overlooking the city and delivers a detailed prophesy regarding the future of Jerusalem and the temple because of the Jewish leader's rejection of Jesus.
- 7. Wednesday -a day of rest; His last time with His disciples and friends.
- 8. Thursday preparation for the Feast of Passover

- a. Jesus' anointed with perfume by the woman at the house of Simon (Matt 26)
- b. Passover meal is celebrated in an upper room
  - i. Jesus washes the disciples' feet (Luke 22; John 13)
  - ii. Tells the disciples that one of them will betray Him (Matt 26; Mark 14; Luke 22; John 13)
  - iii. Judas is identified and leaves the room (Matt 26; Luke 22)
  - iv. Jesus institutes the Last Supper and teaches the disciples about love, the promise of a Helper, peace and prayer. (John 14 18)
  - v. Leave and go to the garden at Gethsemane (Matt 26; Mark 14; Luke 22; John 18)
    - 1. Prays while the disciples sleep
    - 2. Judas leads a band of men to arrest Jesus
    - 3. Peter cuts off Malchus's ear
    - 4. The disciples scatter

## 9. Friday –

- a. Early morning/night (Matt 26-27; Mark 14-15; Luke 22-23; John 18-19)
  - i. Jesus' preliminary hearing before Annas (illegal) guilty
  - ii. Trials before Annas and Caiaphas before dawn (illegal) guilty
  - iii. Fourth trail before the Sanhedrin guilty
  - iv. Fifth trial before Pilate prefect of Judea sent by Tiberius innocent
  - v. Sixth trial before Herod Antipas innocent
  - vi. Seventh trial before Pilate innocent
  - vii. Release of Barabbas the criminal chosen by the people (Matt 27)
  - viii. Jesus is beaten, a crown of thorns on His head; carries His cross
- b. Jesus is crucified beginning at about 9:00 a.m. on Golgotha
  - i. Many believe the same place that Abraham offered Isaac
  - ii. He spoke from the cross several times to offer forgiveness and concern for His mother (Luke 23; John 19)
  - iii. Last words were "It is finished" literally translated means "paid in full." (John 19)
  - iv. His death at approximately 3:00 is the exact hour that the lambs would begin to be slaughtered in the temple to make the blood atonement for sin on Nisan 14 (Exodus 12)
- c. Jesus is taken down from the cross and placed in Joseph's tomb before sunset and the start of Sabbath by Joseph and Nicodemus
